

Fourth Important Update 2025-PRMP-PRE-004

This notification has the purpose of informing **participating** vendors of this RFP¹ the following oral presentation guidelines:

- A) The criteria for evaluating oral presentations will be the following:
- 1. Did the vendor's presentation demonstrate a clear understanding of the specifications of the RFP?
- 2. Did the vendor's presentation demonstrate extensive knowledge of managing the services required by the 2025-PRMP-PRE-004 RFP?
- 3. Did the vendor professionally present and manage their presentation, including time management?
- 4. Did the vendor fully respond to questions asked by the Technical Committee in a direct and applicable manner?²
- 5. Was the overall impression of the strength and quality of the vendor's presentation positive?
- B) Each vendor is to give their presentations based on information already contained in their proposals; vendors may not add new information to the oral presentations.
- C) Each vendor will have up to 45 minutes for their presentation and there will be up to 15 minutes for questions if any. The oral presentations will be conducted via Microsoft teams. Each participating vendor will receive a communication from medicaid.procurement@salud.or.gov with their respective time slot for their presentation. The oral presentations are set for Monday 20th, October 2025.
- D) The vendors are hereby advised that the presentations will not lead to changes in scoring in parts of the evaluation already addressed by the technical proposals. The vendors will only be granted scores following the criteria established in section A of this Important Update. Each of the criteria is worth 10 points, for a total possible 50 points.

² If the committee does not ask questions of the participating vendor, then the vendor shall receive 10 points in this criterion. It will be assumed that the presentation was concise and did not warrant questions.
