Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish that medical residents working in a hospital under the direction of a supervising physician are not required to enroll with Puerto Rico Medicaid Program (PRMP).

Acronym/Term	Definition

Intern or Resident	An individual who participates in an approved Graduate Medical Education (GME) Program or a physician who is authorized to practice only in a hospital setting (e.g., has a temporary or restricted license or is an unlicensed graduate of a foreign medical school); this definition includes interns, residents, and fellows in GME Programs approved for direct GME and Indirect Medical Education (IME) payments by fiscal intermediary/Medicare administrative contractor
NPI	National Provider Identifier
PRMMIS	Puerto Rico Medicaid Management Information System
PRMP	Puerto Rico Medicaid Program

Scope

All references to the PRMP in this policy are inclusive of Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP). This policy covers all intern or resident providers (including out-of-state providers) who are under the supervision of an enrolled physician in the PRMP.

Policy

Unlicensed medical interns and residents are not permitted to enroll with the PRMP. A hospital must use the supervising physician’s National Provider Identifier (NPI) when billing for services rendered by an unlicensed medical intern or resident. Supervising physicians must be a Medicaid enrolled provider.
